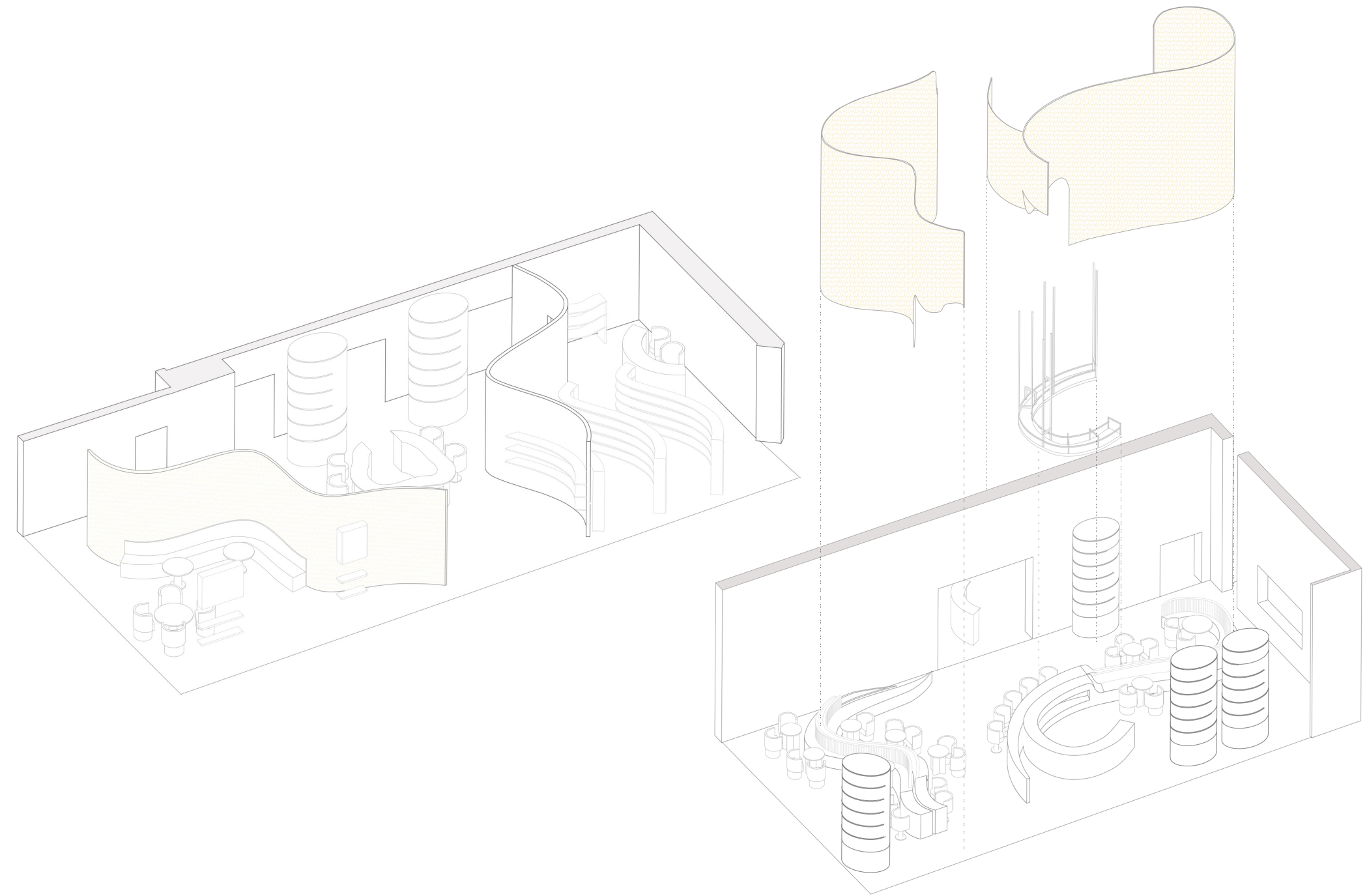


FEEDING THE 5000

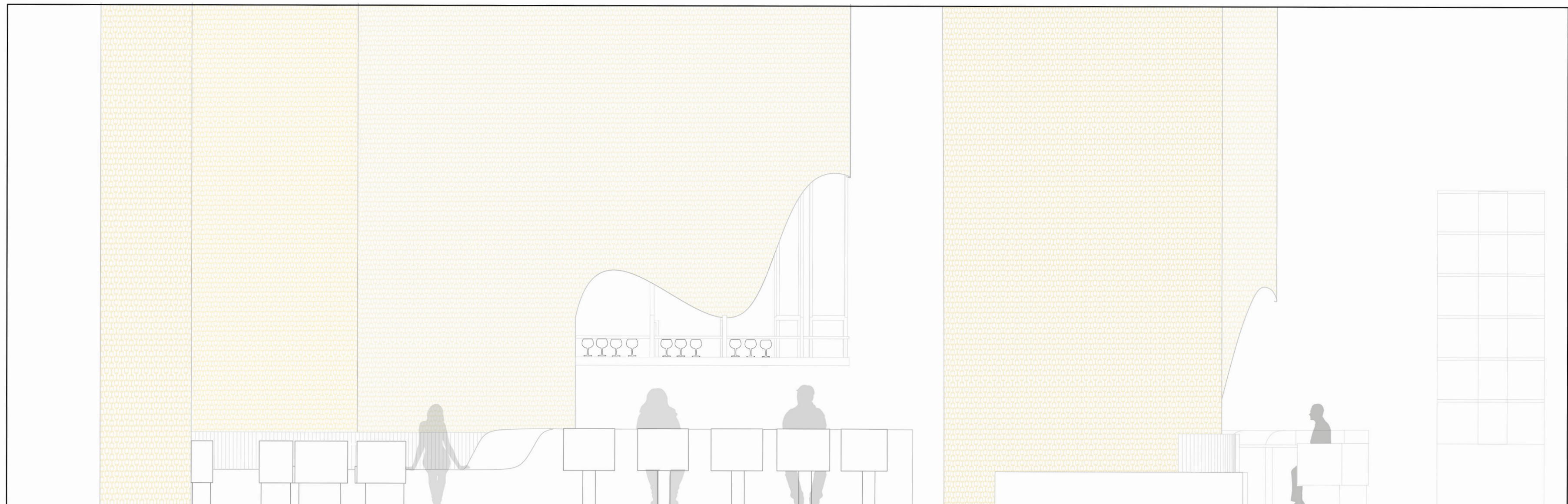

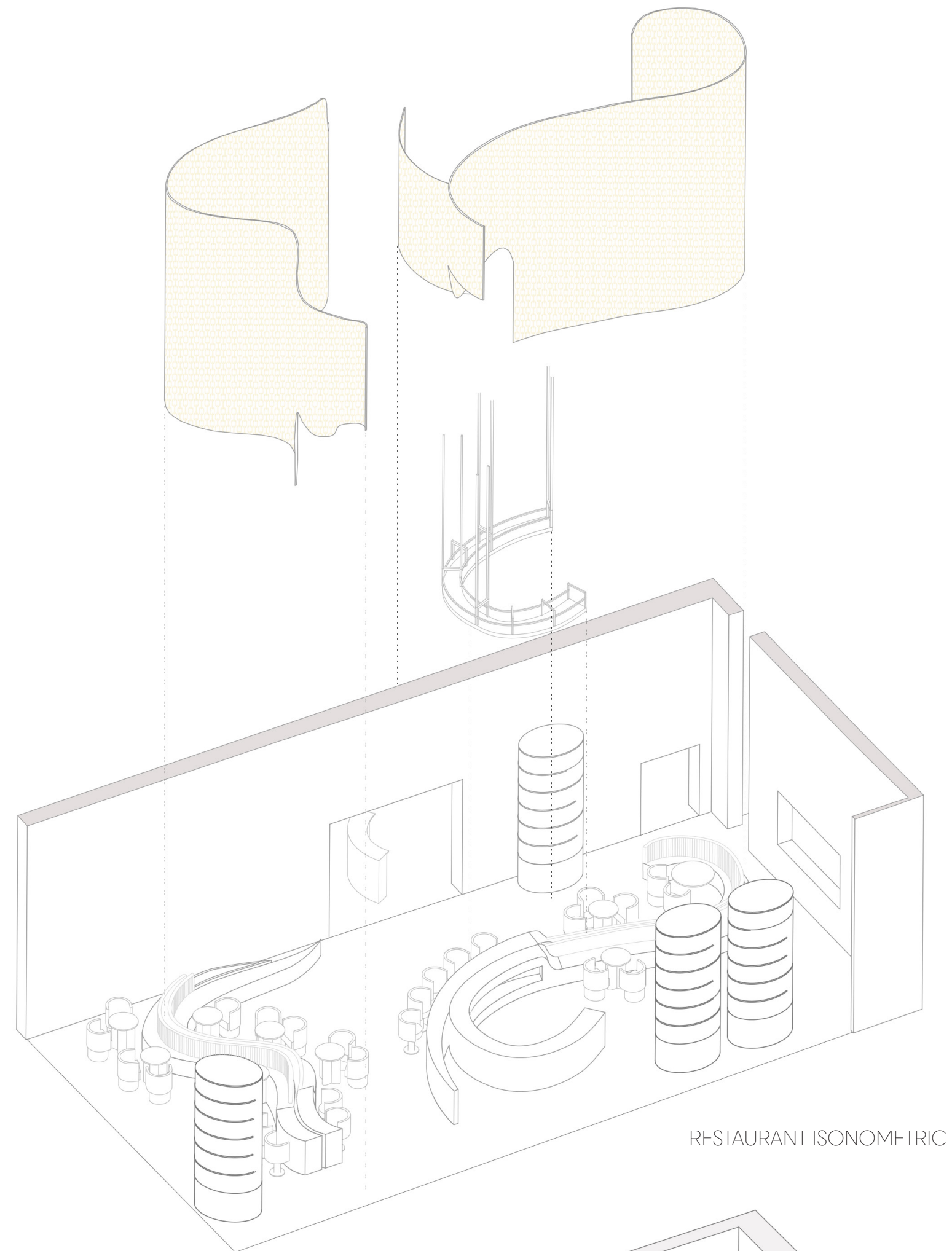




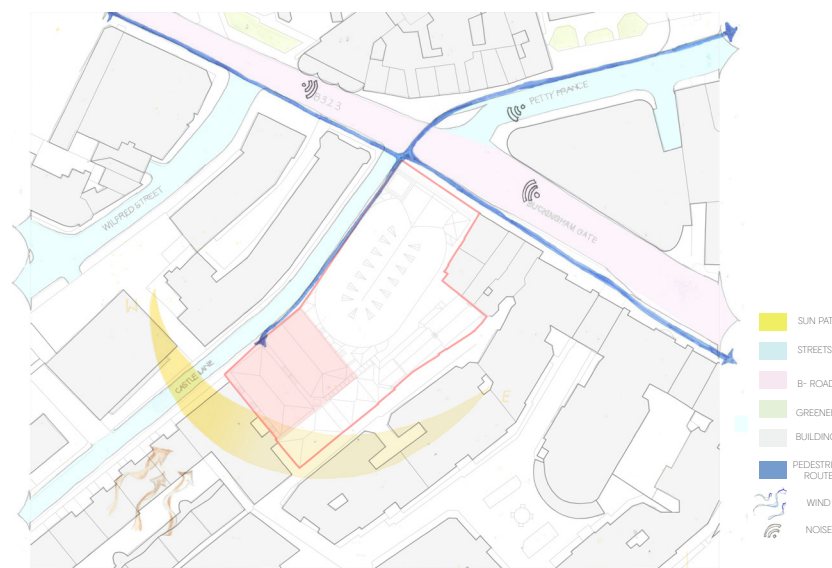

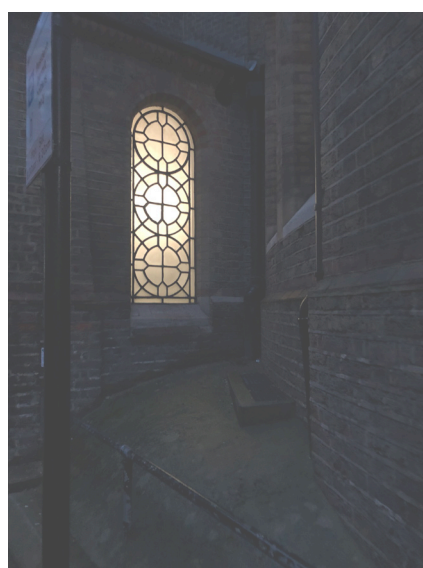

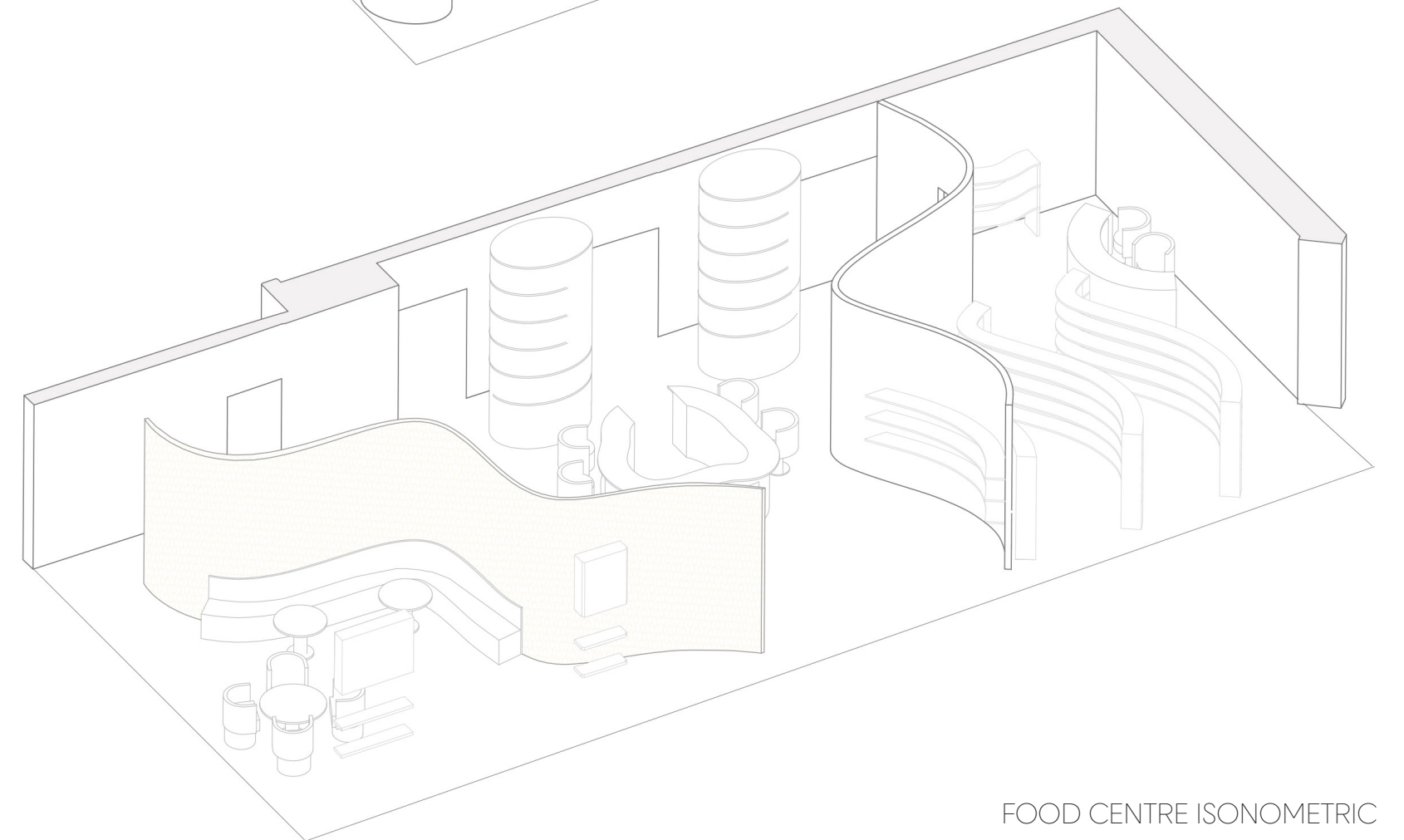
RESTAURANT ISONOMETRIC

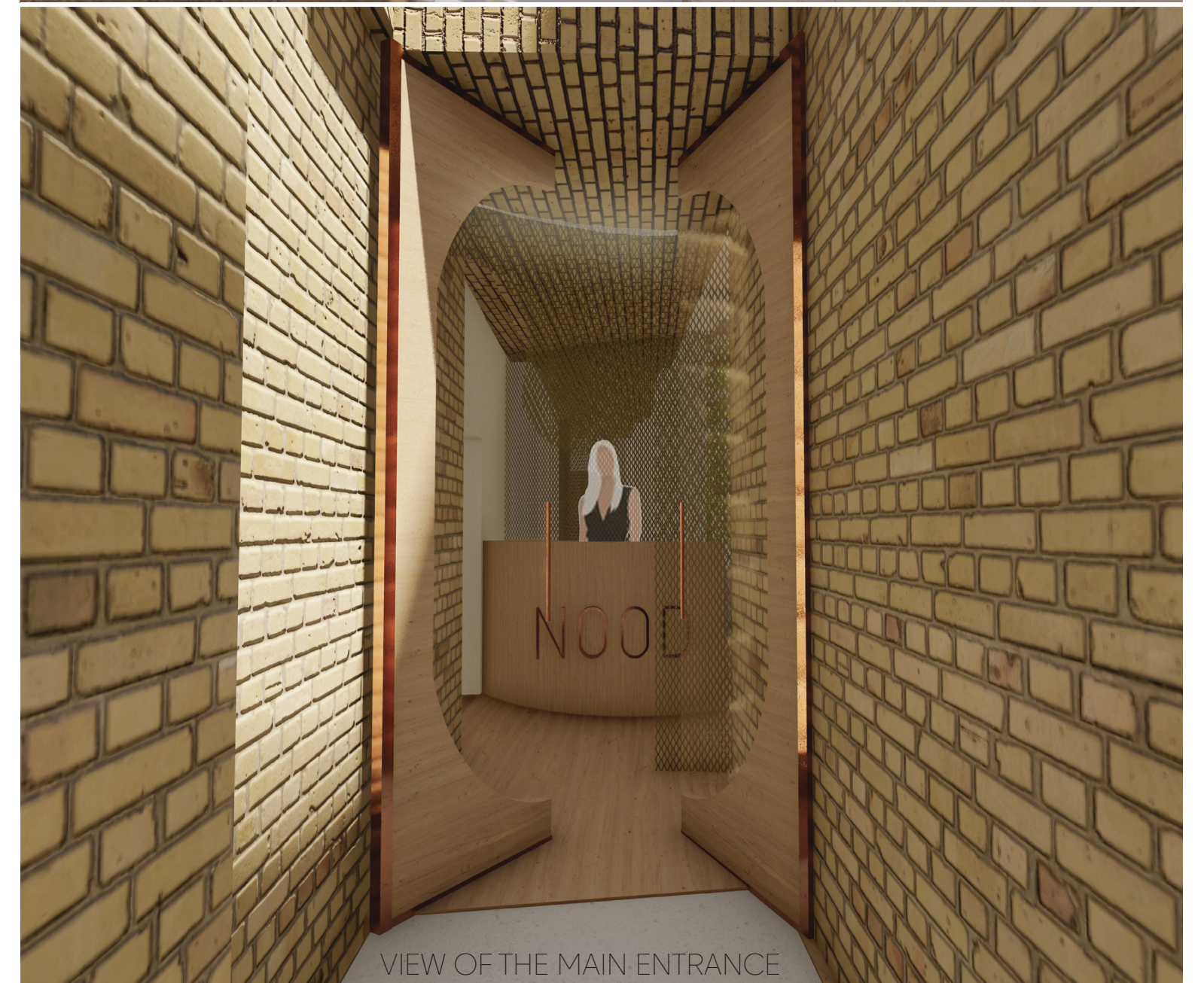
