




Reception area with staff area above.

The main staircase of the building is located at the perimetre so that the internal Hennibique structure is not interrupted. This staircase is enclosed within glass walls, this creates an experiential journey up along the side of the building. As you climb each flight you get glimpses of Sligo Bay, slowly revealing itself as you make your way to the top. This journey to the top floor creates the feeling of the sublime, both terrifying and exhilarating. The enclosure glass provides protection and views but also creates a feeling of fear and exposure as you climb each staircase.



The pods are a timber construction made using a series of hoops supported by brackets and attached using screws and dowels. The pods are clad in brushed recycled aluminium panels, attached with rivets. The robust materiality conveys a feeling of safety and security. Even though you are suspended four storeys high there is some comfort in knowing that the pod is strong and secure.
