Playing with lines of sight, shielded by arches and intriguing corners, patrons can observe without being observed. Throughout the venue, private niches are seamlessly integrated among the stalls, providing solitary dining or group gatherings.

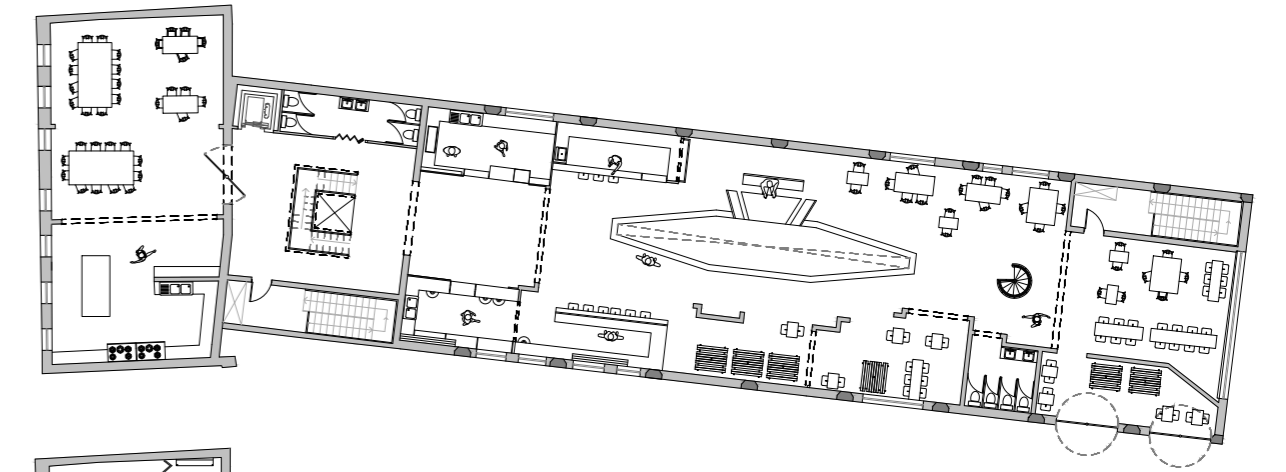


Site plan

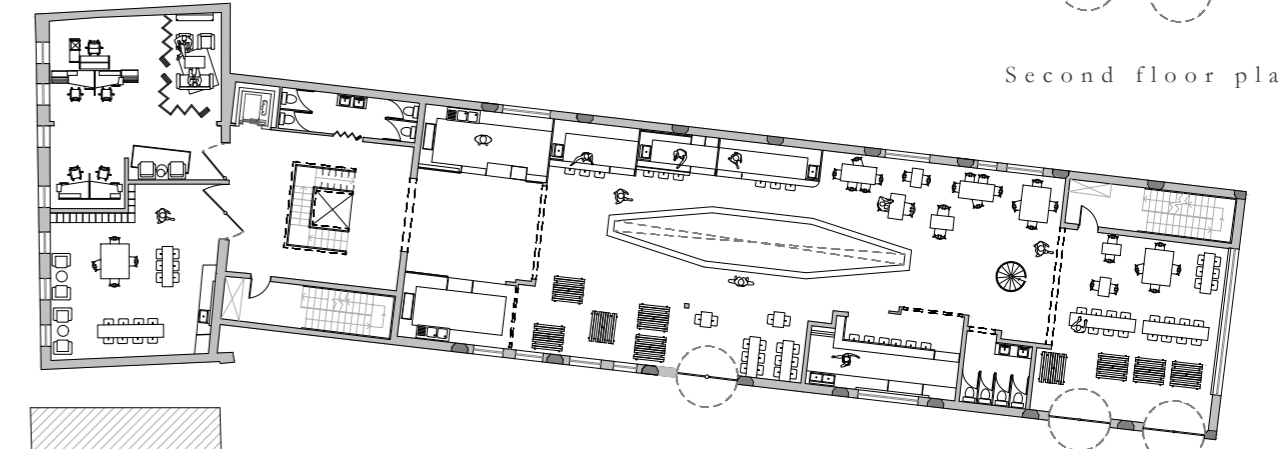


West face elevation

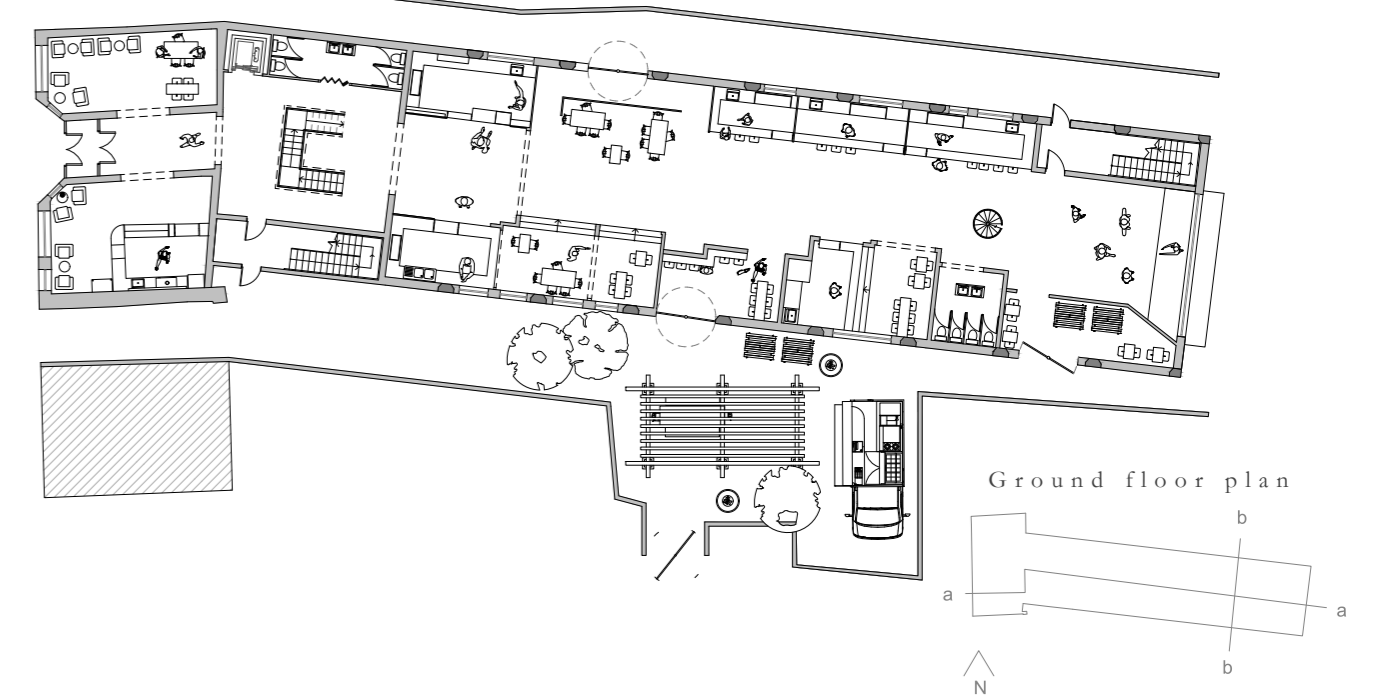

Second floor plan

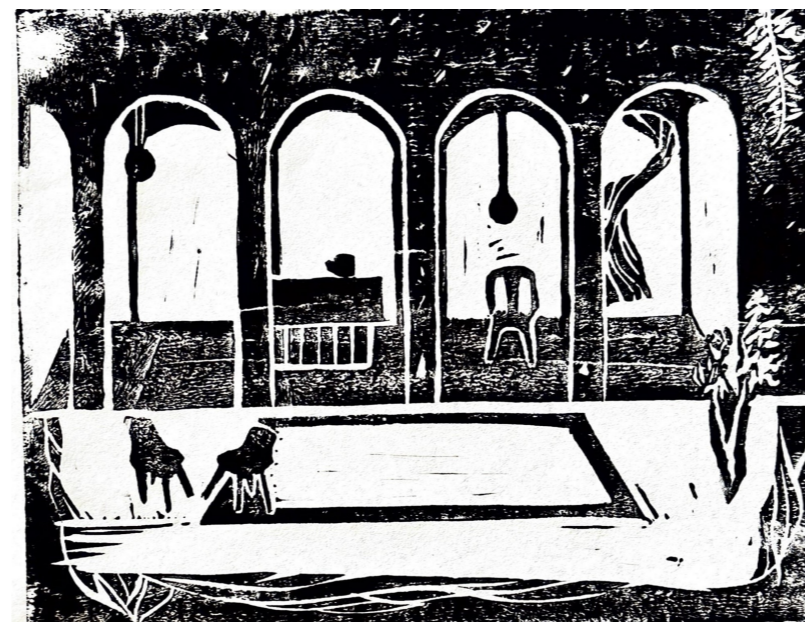
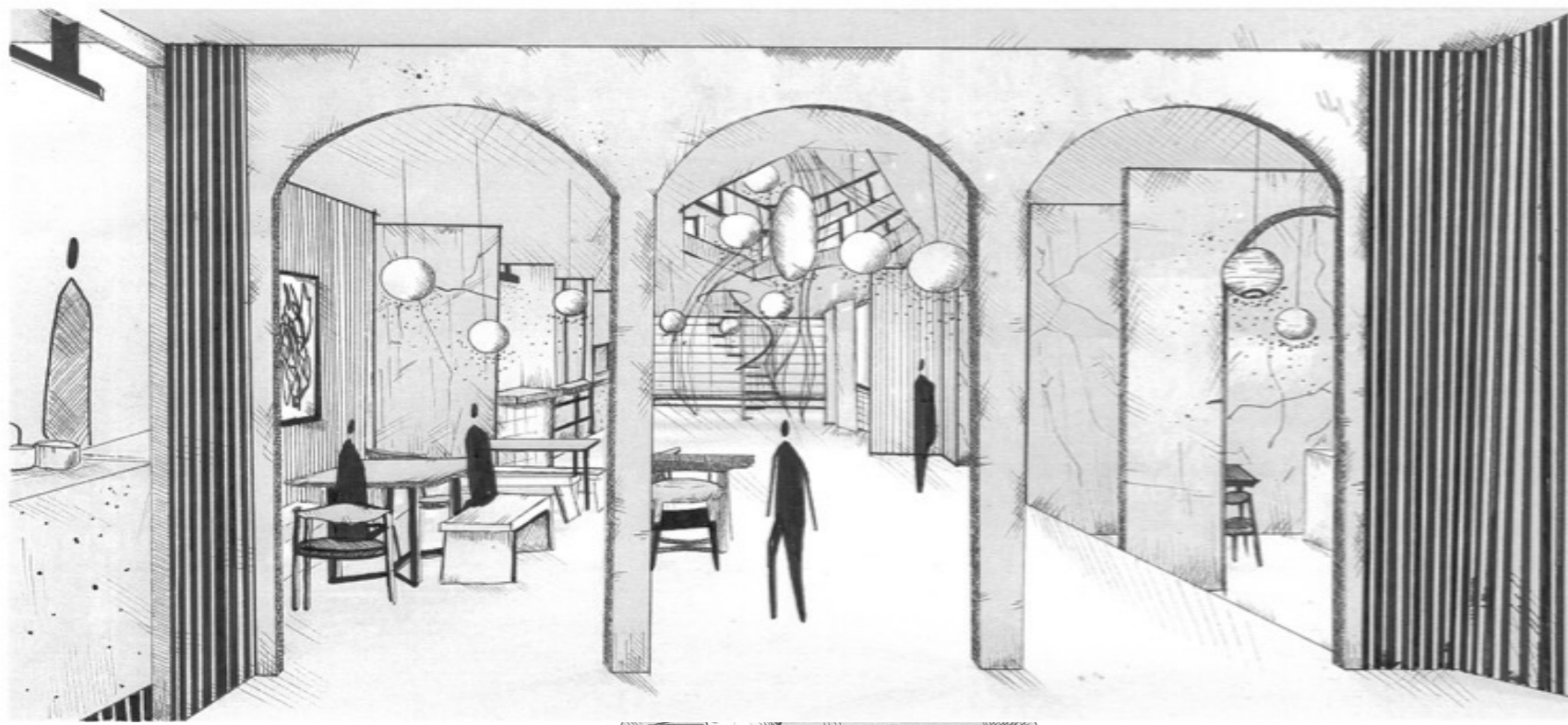


First floor plan



Ground floor plan



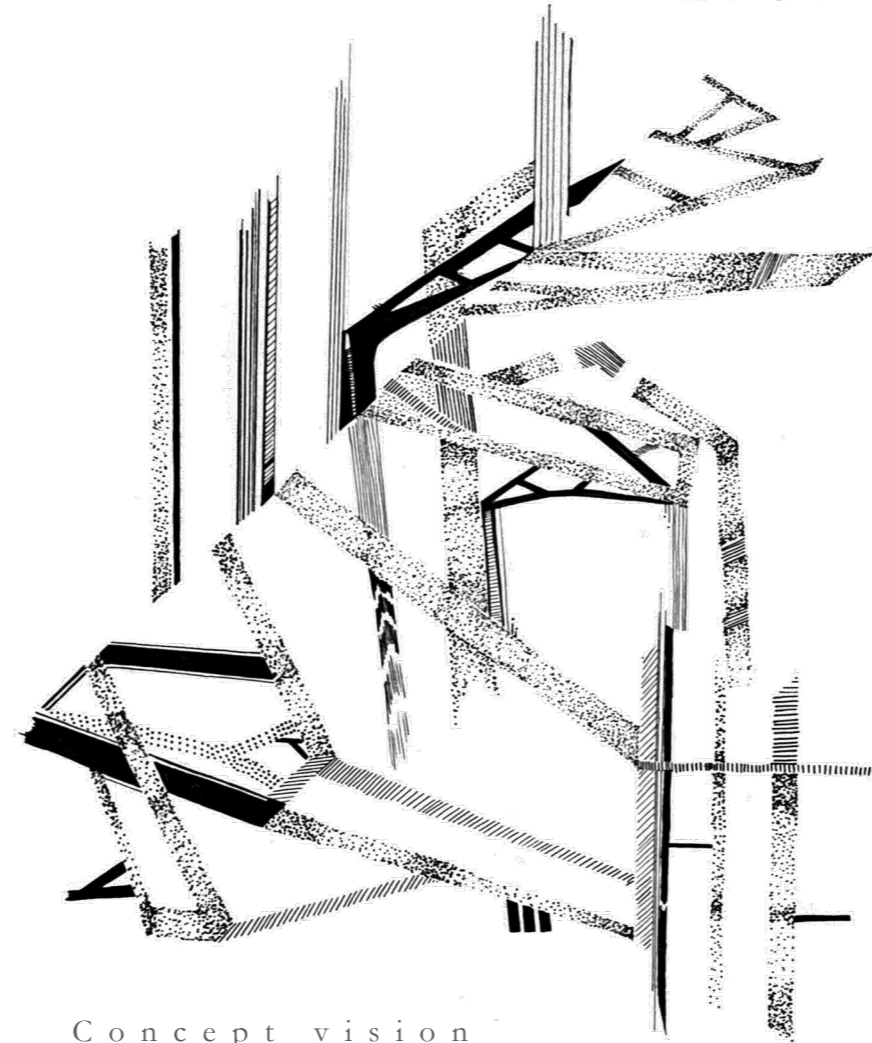
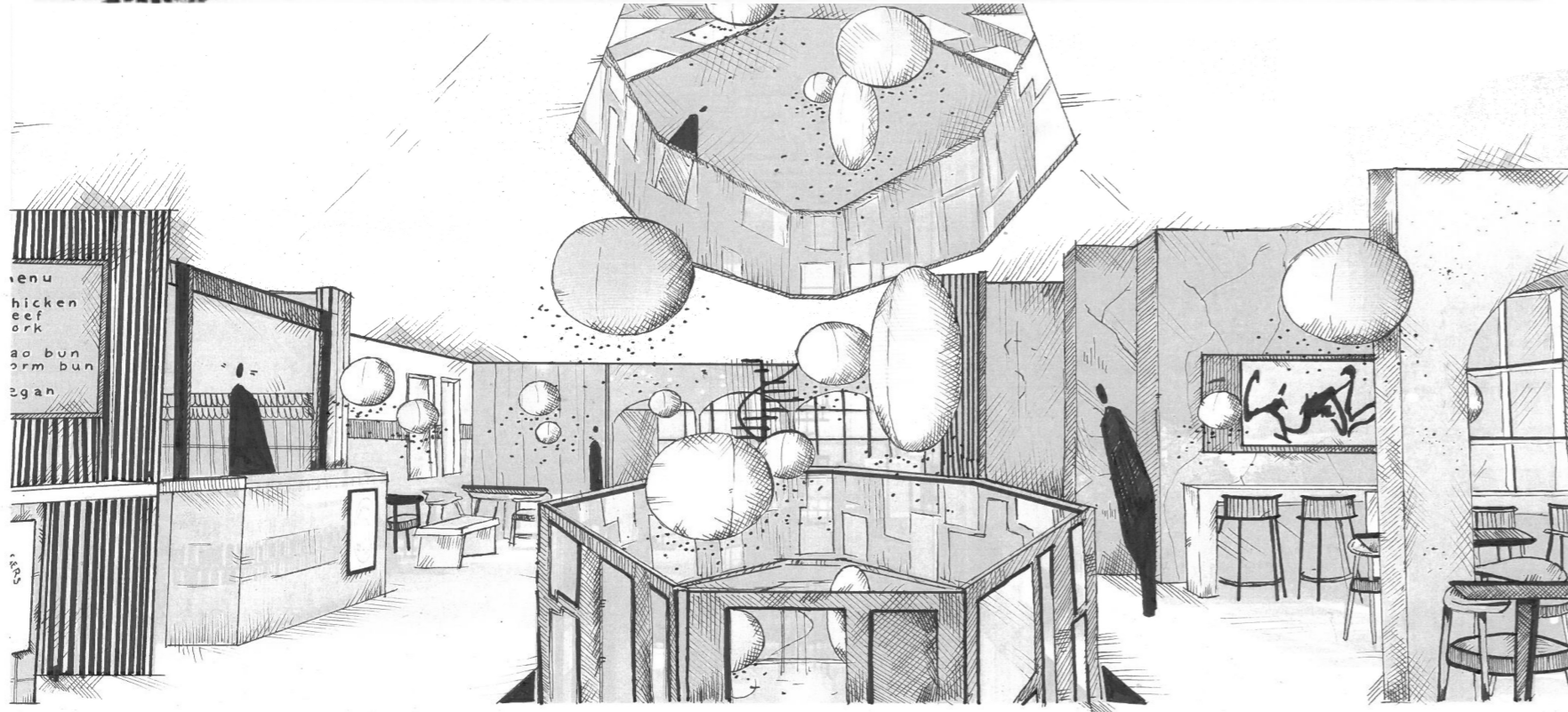


This is the original concept of the space completed in lino and ink.



Cross section b-b

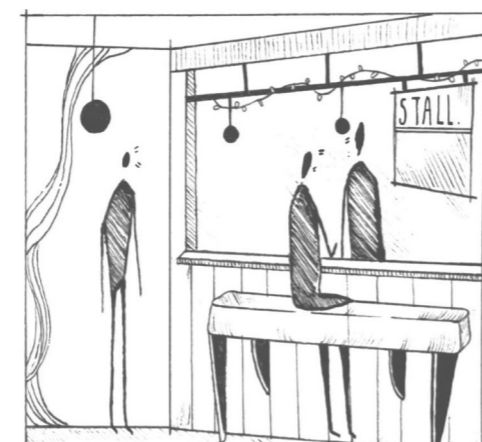
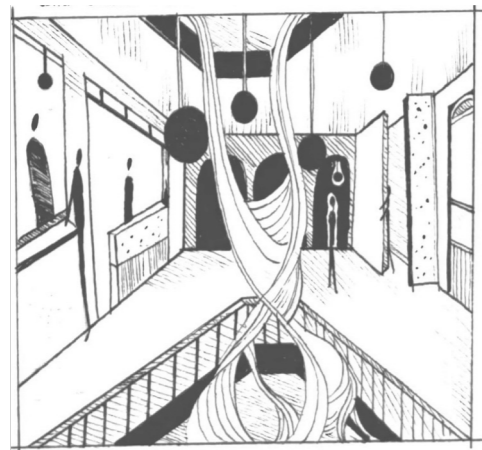
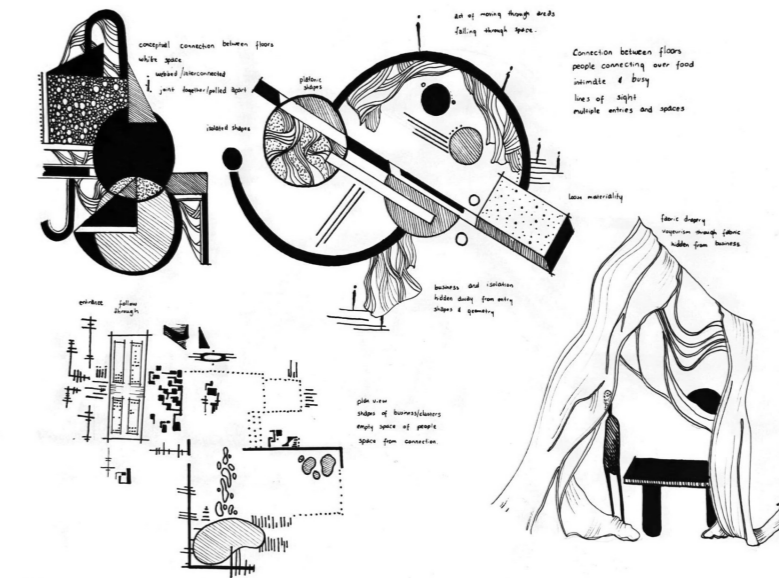
