
Cotton Bloom Residence


My inspiration came from this particular project where a 19th century cotton mill was transformed into a hotel. The bright peach tones used evoked a sense a warmth and joy. Brighter colours are introduced in the hotel's bedrooms, which take note from vintage posters that advertised trading between the region and the "warmer and brighter corners of the globe". Walls are salmon-pink, while soft-furnishings are upholstered in pistachio-green fabric.



Concept

I wanted to connect the space to its surrounding city of Manchester. Manchester was the first city to industrialise, the cotton trade was rapidly expanding here in the mid 18th century. Cotton was being imported at a rate of 1000 tonnes a year by 175. The number of mills in Manchester peaked at 108 in 1853, as numbers began to decline, other towns in the region saw aboost in trade. The city was even nicknamed Cottonopolis. I want to honour this history through my design by incorporating textures and textiles that allow the heritage to weave through the space. Cotton is primarily composed of cellulose, an insoluble organic compound, and is soft and fluffy in texture. The cotton industry can be weaved through my design through textiles such as linens and upholstery, as well as elements of woven patterns and shapes resembling cotton plants.
