To chose an existing structure at Ridley Road street Market area in London and design a mult-use space for the local community. One of the uses had to be connected to food.


PROPOSAL:

After having visited the site and interviewd locals I decide to re-use the existing structure and design:


1) retail units on top of the existing structure for traders to have better working environment

The design was inspired by the shapes and forms of the market stalls and the vivid atmosphere of the market.








Analysis of the shapes and form of the trading stalls that the overall design is based on.

Proposed roof line




Plan view + stalls as united entity









2 - Street retail spaces



3 - Food hall




4 - Seating / Bureau

Experimental model that explores the spatial qualities of the food hall area more in depth. The model represents the clay tile elements, curved forms and the soft lighting in the space.


