



Extend is a collaborative project across first year Interior Design, Interior Architecture and Dance. Over the course of four weeks. the Interiors students work in small teams of 8 / 9 people to design and build at 1:1 (life size) structures / objects for the dancers (their client) to engage with as part of a live, choreographed, public performance.

Starting with research, the students connect through a dance workshop, with the designers studying the world of their Dance counterparts. They look for opportunities in the dancers practice and are tasked with helping them to 'extend' their form and amplify their movements. From this point, they sketch, make models and start to develop ideas which are gradually prototyped and tested at full size. At various points through the project, the students meet with one another to share updates and swap feedback. The structures in their starting position had to fit within a one metre squared footprint, with the ability to 'extend'.












Y1 INTERIORS + DANCE **COLLABORATIVE BUILD PROJECT**

CRITERIA_

- Structures should be no larger than 2 metres high with a 1 metre x 1 metre footprint when in their contracted state. They will need to be mobile and fit in the lift.
- When not in use the structures / objects will return to their 'dock', and will need to consider the neighbouring structures.
- · You could consider a permanent stand within your dock which objects can be taken and returned from, or you could think about the whole structure being moved out and back in when not in use.
- · Consider how dancers will engage with your design, what opportunities can it offer for performance.



















