The Alchemy of Knowledge through Fairytales





The second manifesto represents the connection between nature and the alchemist with the library and the essence of it. The power that can be achieved and the mystery


surrounding it. Everything its matching and combines in better, the transformation, and the science, the knowledge meets the belief.



Facade

The facade has been changed in a way that kept the old design of the building, a combination between **old and new**. Evolving and in the same time considering the past. The sides increased the area of windows allowing more natural light inside.

The center of the first floor took the pattern of the timber and substitung it with stained glass in order to create a bit of magic and playfulness with the help of sun.
