











Unravelled: Weaving Kingston's Fashion Legacy

In a vibrant collaboration with The Community Brain, our exhibition Unravelled celebrates the spirit of fashion in Kingston - threading past and present through the story of Kingston School of Art's ground-breaking victory at the 1965 St. Gall competition, led by the visionary Daphne Brooker.

Opening at Fusebox in September 2025, the exhibition is rooted in the fabric of the site itself. By working closely with the space, we uncovered its quirks and qualities allowing our design to grow organically within its frame.

At the heart of Unravelled is a simple idea: that fashion is connection. Threads link people, places, histories—and we've brought this metaphor to life through sweeping, double-curved walls that ebb and flow through the space. These forms create a modular system that not only shapes the journey but also invites discovery and interaction.




