#### Brief




#### Proposal and Aims:


According to Local News and Interviews, Ladywell is a stressful area with economic difficulties. Food banks that were a great help to locals are closing, and Middle Aged Workers mentioned they needed leisure facilities without having to travel far. Therefore, I designed a Community Space with theatre that provides **Charity Shop/** Food Banks and **Cafe**. Money raised from **Theatre** and Cafe are used for Food Banks and to continue the program designed. The space are also used to donate items for charity. The theatres provide platforms for new young artists and actors to display their talents to the public. When not used as performance space, it provides a **'Theatre Workshop'** for children as well. The Community Space are open for everyone from different economic background and age to socialize and connect.

#### Scenography, Historical, Theatrical

Spherical Pods that are Hovering and Floating are installed inside the listed building. This is to fulfill my intention to create an exciting scenography of floating giant bubbles or water droplets that could be inhabited. This decision is inspired by the Building's previous use as a swimming area and a public bath house.






- 1. Frames and tension steel to support roof and building structure


Flexible Space




# CHARITY / THEATRE WORKSHOP

While preserving the existing features of the buildings, I included contrasting colours and textures for the new installed element. To create an illusion of floating, the 'blue bubbles' are supported with mirror cladding that is camouflaged with the surroundings, thus making it an 'invisible' support.





## Performance Area


Two choices of seating are available which are seating in front of the stage, and seating that hovers above them (on the First Floor). The seat in front of the stage has an L shape, facing diagonally towards the stage, which works for slim and small buildings. Seatings are accessed from either end of the L shape.

- 2. Concrete
- 3. Steel Beam
- 4. Steel Frame
- 5. Blue Translucent Fibre Glass
- 6. Steel Pillar
