In this way, the interior represents a timescale moulded by inhabiting it, an extension of the person living in it.
























The most abundant and useful discarded resorce in this flat is paper packaging, letters and recipts. These records need a few hours of soaking to prepare for making pulp. This type of material plays a temporary part in our lives, as common as shedding our skin (something that takes 2-4 weeks).

The paper is blended in water then lifted out of the suspension with a mesh to form a thin sheet that is left to dry.


