

## SOMEWHERE IN BENGAL



MY DESIGN PROPOSAL FOR A TEA HOUSE/GARDEN ENCAPSULATES THE ESSENCE OF THE BENGAL RENAISSANCE, A PIVOTAL PERIOD IN BENGALI CULTURAL HISTORY MARKED BY A FERVENT REVIVAL OF ART, LITERATURE, AND THEATRE. DRAWING INSPIRATION FROM THIS RICH HERITAGE, THE TEA HOUSE SERVES AS A SANCTUARY WHERE VISITORS CAN IMMERSE THEMSELVES IN THE INTELLECTUAL AND ARTISTIC PURSUITS THAT DEFINED THE ERA. THE ARCHITECTURE SEAMLESSLY BLENDS TRADITIONAL BENGALI MOTIFS WITH MODERN DESIGN ELEMENTS, CREATING A SPACE THAT PAYS HOMAGE TO THE PAST WHILE EMBRACING THE PRESENT.

AS A PART OF MY PROJECT I HAD TO ALSO INCLUDE AN ARTEFACT ALONGSIDE MY PROPOSAL. I DECIDED TO PAINT WITH OILS ON CANVAS THE VISION I HAVE FOR ONE OF MY SPACES IN MY TEA HOUSE. IN PARTICULAR THIS PAINTING PORTRAYS A PERSON LOOKING THROUGH THE ARCHES CONECTING MY DOME AS IF THEY WERE TO WALK TOWARDS THE THEATRE SPACE. THE DOME SITS DIRECTLY ABOVE THE CENTRAL STAIRCASE MAKING IT A FOCAL POINT IN MY DESIGN.


## CONCEPT

MY CONCEPT DERIVES FROM THE STAGGERED LAYERING OF SPACES IMITATING TRADITIONAL BANGLADESH TEA GARDENS. I ALSO AIM TO SYMBOLIZE THE MEANING BEHIND THE BENGALI RENAISSANCE ITSELF. THE RENAISSANCE HAPPENED DURING A TIME OF BRITISH COLONIAL RULE AND IT WAS ESSENTIAL IN REMINDING THE PUBLIC WHAT THEY STOOD FOR AS A COUNTRY WITH THEIR OWN IDENTITY BEING TAKEN AWAY FROM THEM.

STAIRS ARE A MAJOR PART IN MY DESIGN AND ALSO FORMS PART OF MY CONCEPT. I HAVE DECIDED TO INCORPORATE A STAIRCASE FEATURE IN THE MIDDLE OF MY BUILDING THAT WILL BE VISIBLE WHEN USERS WALK INTO THE SPACE. THIS HELICAL STAIRCASE THAT WILL MIMIC A TREE LIKE STRUCTURE WILL GO ALL THE WAY TO THE TOP FLOOR OF THE BUILDING WITH MULTIPLE STAIRCASES 'BRANCHING' OUT TO DIFFERENCE MEZZANINE FLOORS.
