


The Gibside Estate is one of Capability Brown's masterpieces, the engineering of the landscape to achieve symmetry within the avenues is of an unthinkable scale today. Symmetry is a key narrative in the design with the alteration of the facades of the stables to achieve a true Palladian style.

The Stables are an exploration hub for photographers and public to plan their trips around the expansive site; several outposts are scattered around the site to provide cover and frame vantage points, maximising the Genius Loci of the site. Throughout the design process rules of photography such as the rule of two thirds and the golden ratio have been used to shape the design.




